Thank you for writing to us.

We have carefully considered what you say but we have decided not to cancel your Penalty Charge Notice.

You were given a Penalty Charge Notice for parking on a double yellow line. Double yellow lines mean no parking at any time, except to load or unload. However, the Civil Enforcement Officer (CEO) watched your vehicle and saw no loading or unloading taking place. Because the rule applies 24 hours a day, seven days a week, double yellow lines do not need to be accompanied by a sign.

You were parked close to a junction. Enforcing the parking rules near junctions helps to keep junctions free of parked vehicles which improves safety. Vehicles can turn in and out more easily and drivers and pedestrians have a clearer view of each other.

Any loading or unloading needs to be carried out and then the vehicle moved straight after. For example, drivers are allowed time to carry goods or equipment into a building, but not time to install or unpack them. It seems you were parked for longer than you needed for the loading or unloading that you did. Also, the CEO watched your vehicle and saw no loading or unloading taking place.


You have these choices:

- You can pay the discount charge of £65.00 if your payment reaches us within 14 days of the date of this letter.
- You can pay £130.00 within 28 days of the date your Penalty Charge Notice was issued.
- You can formally challenge your Penalty Charge Notice by using a Notice to Owner form. The vehicle's owner will automatically receive the form if the Penalty Charge Notice has not been paid within 28 days of being issued. The form offers you the chance to formally challenge your Penalty Charge Notice or pay the full £130.00. If you decide to formally challenge your Penalty Charge Notice, please do not write to us again but wait until the Notice to Owner form arrives.

How to pay

- **online** at www.newham.gov.uk using a debit/credit card.
- **by phone** 020 8430 2000 (24 hour automated service) using a debit/credit card. Please have your Penalty Charge Notice number ready (see above).
- **by post** please make your cheques, postal orders or bank drafts payable to London Borough of Newham; write your Penalty Charge Notice number (see above) and the vehicle registration mark on the back; then send it to: London Borough of Newham, Parking and Traffic Enforcement, PO Box 1125, Warrington WA55 1EJ.
